

Louise's Jelly Slice Recipe

- 250g sweet biscuits
- 175g butter melted
- 395g condensed milk
- ½ cup lemon juice
- ¾ cup boiling water
- 2 tpsps gelatin powder
- 85g jelly crystals

Method

1. Prepare 20x30cm slice pan
2. Process biscuits and add melted butter and mix and refrigerate for 30 minutes
3. Combine the lemon juice and condensed milk
4. Combine boiling water and gelatine in a small jug. Stir until completely dissolved, then stir into condensed milk mixture. Pour over biscuit base and return to the refrigerator for 1 hour or until set.
5. Meanwhile, prepare jelly according to packet instructions, using 100ml less cold water than directed. Allow to come to room temperature. Pour jelly mixture over set milk filling. Chill for a further 1 hour or until jelly is set.
